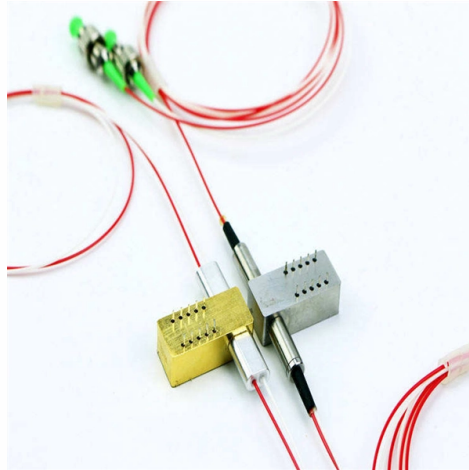


How to test optical attenuation in optical cables



Overview

Fiber optic testing of a newly installed system not only verifies that the system meets its design requirements, but also creates a performance baseline for all future testing and troubleshooting of the system. Corning recommends that all fiber optic systems be tested to a minimum set. While there are many different fiber optic cable tests, the most common version is an insertion loss test, also known as an attenuation, jumper, or connectivity test. This test requires a special testing kit and protective eyewear, but it will help you diagnose problems with the cables. Fiber optic testing ensures the performance and reliability of fiber optic networks. The most fundamental parameter for optical fiber is geometry, since the dimensions of the fiber determine its ability to be spliced and terminated to other fibers. Understanding it is crucial for anyone involved in data centers, telecommunications, or enterprise networking.
