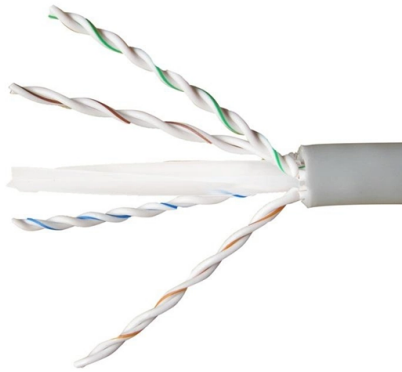


Poor splicing of fiber optic drop cable



Overview

Poor Fiber Cleave: Angled or chipped cleaves prevent proper core alignment.
Misalignment: Incorrect positioning of fibers leads to light leakage. Core vs Cladding
Mismatch: Using different fiber types without adjustment. What is it that gets spliced onto a fiber optic cable strand or strands?

We call it a fiber-optic pigtail. 2dB/km (typical SMF-28e+ at 1550nm), you've got 20dB of loss due to the glass path, but then the 10 splices would add another 5dB if your splices are 0. 5dB (a *really* bad splice) each. However, in real-world installations, whether underground, aerial, or in harsh industrial environments, fiber cables can and do fail. While some loss is unavoidable, excessive loss can compromise network performance. Modern fiber optic networks usually keep splice loss. Why is the acceptable loss on a splice so low?

A high loss on a fusion splice can mean that the fusion of the two fibers may not have properly occurred and you have a weak slice that could fail pre-maturely.
